

Resolution No. 2012-10

Letter of Intent to File a System-Wide Improvement Framework

for

Reclamation District No. 1000

WHEREAS, the Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) in a letter dated August 2012 removed Reclamation District No. 1000 (District) from the PL 84-99 Rehabilitation and Inspection Program (RIP) due to encroachments, erosion and bank caving in the system as identified in their most recent Periodic Inspection which the Corps has determined does not meet their standards for operation and maintenance; and

WHEREAS, the Corps letter further states Local Maintaining Agencies may be reinstated into the RIP if they submit a Letter of Intent to develop a System-Wide Improvement Framework (SWIF) to make improvements to the levee system on a “worst-first” basis to transition them to Corps standards over time; and

WHEREAS, implementation of the Natomas Levee Improvement Project (NLIP) addresses most if not all of the deficiencies identified in the Corps Periodic Inspection; and


WHEREAS, the District strongly supports implementation of the NLIP as soon as practical, desires to be reinstated into the RIP and supports development of a plan to improve our levee system on a ‘worst-first’ basis;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

Reclamation District No 1000’s Board of Trustees hereby directs the General Manager to submit a Letter of Intent to develop a System-Wide Improvement Framework (SWIF) to the Central Valley Flood Protection Board. In turn, we request the Central Valley Flood Protection Board, as the project sponsor, forward our request to the Corps of Engineers as appropriate.
