#### 2A) Treasurer's Report – December 2004

#### 2B) EXPENDITURE REPORT-December 2004

The expenditures for the month of December 2004 were \$245,138.45. Warrants 7225 & 7226 were issued in the amount of \$200,000.00.

#### 3) Sacramento River Erosion Site Report Presentation – MBK

Gil Cosio and Rick Reinhardt from MBK reviewed the recent Sacramento River Erosion Site Report prepared for the District. New sites were noted, and changes from the 1999 report were cited. Additionally, Mr. Cosio showed the board a sample of the work that MBK has been involved in to repair erosions sites in other areas. The board discussed using some of those environmentally friendly

construction methods as a proactive measure where there is adequate berm remaining and the erosion is not into the levee profile.

District Engineer Clifton stated that Pete Rabbon of the Department of Water Resources has sent out a letter to Reclamation District's admonishing them to repair the erosion sites on their levees. District Engineer Clifton forwarded the letter to the District's attorneys at Downey, Brand. Downey, Brand will be responding with a letter reminding DWR that channel maintenance is a State responsibility and that the Reclamation District's are responsible for maintenance of the levee not the river banks. District Engineer Clifton believes the State will attempt to get legislation started, making the responsibility for bank protection a local responsibility. The District will have to be vigilant. The Flood Control Association is going to employ Bob Reed to lobby on behalf of the local districts. There will be a special assessment charged for the lobbying efforts.

There are several bills drafted at legislative counsel regarding how flood control costs will be paid for, and one bill to exempt flood control costs from Proposition 218 coverage.

#### 4) Committee Reports

Trustee Chase asked the status of scheduling a meeting with Bob Overstreet or the Mayor, and if the Urbanization Report has been sent to the Mayor's office. District Engineer Clifton stated that the copies of the report for distribution were received from Akiyama Architects and that he would draft a letter for Trustee Harris' signature before sending the reports out. The Urbanization Committee will schedule a meeting with the Mayor's office to review the report.

#### 5A) Sacramento County Pooled Investment Fund Policy

It was moved by Trustee Gilbert to receive and accept the Sacramento County Pooled Investment Fund Policy as submitted. Seconded by Trustee Chase, duly put and carried.

Trustee Gilbert requested a copy of the Sacramento County Pooled Investment Fund Audit.

#### 5) Engineer's Report

#### a) Sacramento River Emergency Work Status

District Engineer Clifton informed the Board that the tin building has been removed from the concrete structure and Nordic has put in a ramp to get to the site.

The board discussed using one of the methods outlined by MBK at the pump house site. District Engineer Clifton stated that he is not opposed to using debris boxes, if the erosion is not into the levee profile and the depth of the river in that location allows it. If the erosion is into the levee section then something else will have to be done to save the levee.

#### b) Setback Levee Discussion

Trustee Chase asked if the boxes could be used at River Mile 78, the location of the proposed setback levee. District Engineer Clifton stated that the river may be too deep in that location. SAFCA is still looking at alternatives for the site.

### c. Office Rehabilitation Update

District Engineer Clifton stated that some contractors will refuse to bid because, they don't want to deal with prevailing wage issues and paperwork. Counsel for the insurance company has said prevailing wage applies. Counsel for the District does not believe that prevailing wage applies if the insurance company bids the contract. District Engineer Clifton stated when bids are received they will be 15 to 20% higher because of prevailing wage issues. The contract will be let by the District though the costs will be paid by the insurance company.

#### d. Bank Protection Issues

#### Other Matters

Trustee Chase suggested that the personnel committee meet early this year to discuss finding a replacement for District Engineer Clifton who is retiring at the end of the year. 

District Engineer Clifton explained that it was not acceptable and the plans will have to be redone. Beezer will probably lose 20 to 25 homes. Mr. Meyers also showed a post a cable fence along the canal but was informed that the minimum requirement for fencing was a chain link fence a minimum of 4 feet in height.

Trustee Lauppe asked what the status was on the set back levee. District Engineer Clifton stated that he hasn't had an update on that project from SAFCA in two months. The Corps of Engineers is reviewing the report. The report commissioned by the District showed that that here had been no movement at the proposed set back levee location.

#### 4A) OFFICE BUILDING REPAIR CONTRACT AWARD

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that bids have been accepted for the repair of the office damaged by fire in September. The low bid is from Dual Cal. They originally wanted to pull their bid because of a mathematical error in the

bid. District Engineer Clifton discussed the error with the architect and attorney and allowed Dual Cal to submit an amended bid. The amended bid is still significantly lower than the other two bids received. Dual Cal is a local company and has done work on schools for the architect. There have been no bid protests. The plan if the contract is awarded it to give the contractor notice to proceed and for work to begin a week from Monday, on April 18<sup>th</sup>.

The District's insurance broker has determined the policy with coverage will cover the cost of the repair. The broker has notified the insurance company of this but has not heard back at this time.

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Chase to award the contract to repair the office to Dual Cal and authorize the District Engineer to sign the contract as reviewed by counsel. Seconded by Trustee Miller, duly put and carried.

#### 4B) EASEMENT ACCEPTANCE & ASSIGNMENTS

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that in 1994 SAFCA obtained easements from four property owners in the Dry Creek floodway. They are now obtaining fee ownership to the underlying property and will convey a recreation easement to the City of Sacramento. All of the easements are within the boundaries of American River Flood Control District (ARFCD); however two of the easements were accidentally assigned to Reclamation District No. 1000. Counsel has prepared a resolution to accept from SAFCA and assign to ARFCD the two easements as outlined.

Motion by Trustee Gilbert to adopt Resolution 2005-04 as prepared by counsel accepting and assigning the easements and authorizing the District Engineer to sign the assignment of easements to ARFCD. Seconded by Trustee Chase, duly put and carried.

#### 4C) EASEMENT QUITCLAIM – Duckhorn Lane

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the District has received a request for the District to quitclaim an easement that is no longer needed for the K-3 Drain west of I-5. The District previously quitclaimed a portion of this easement to the property owner.

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Barandas to approve the quitclaim as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Gilbert, and passed by the following vote:

#### 5) SAFCA – Activities Update

Stein Buer, Executive Director of SAFCA reviewed SAFCA's Strategic Plan for flood control in the Sacramento Area. The Strategic plan calls for a minimum 100-year level of flood protection for the Sacramento region and then additional flood control until the region has 200-year protection or better. This year a major milestone will be the re-mapping and certifying of levees. The Sacramento River Levee system is a top priority. The Corps of Engineers (COE) have identified

several critical sites on the Sacramento River levee bank that need bank protection. SAFCA was seeking to use the Sacramento Bank Protection fund for these sites but has run in to difficulties with mitigation and funding. Mr. Buer stated that SAFCA is hoping to go to work on these sites this summer. The Natomas Minimum Plan is to review the Natomas levees and assure they provide 100-year level of protection. They will be looking at stability, erosion and under levee seepage. Butch Hodgkins is coordinating the Lower Sacramento River Regional Project, reaching out to others in the region such as Yolo County to cooperate in flood control.

This is being done in conjunction with re-operation of Folsom dam and its improvements. The first step is to modify the operations and second to modify the outlets; currently there are four upper outlets and two more will be added. Construction on the additional outlets is anticipated to begin in August and continue through 2012. The third step it to raise the dam by seven feet, increasing the flood storage capacity by 95,000 acre feet. Raising the dam is in the planning stages. The current maximum flow out of Folsom is 145 CFS and the levees can carry that capacity with the improvements constructed in the last five years on the American River levees.

The Strategic Plan also calls for Common Work Features. This would include improvements of flood control on local streams and creeks.

Levee maintenance has become increasingly difficult over the years because of environmental issues. New techniques have been developed to provide erosion protection and environmental enhancement. SAFCA is active in involving the community in optimizing flood control. The Flood Management Plan promotes good land use planning. There is approximately \$100 million worth for flood control improvements to be done and financing will be a big issue. The Corps of Engineers has no money and the State has little.

Butch Hodgkins reviewed the Natomas Minimum Plan for the Board. There have been some ad hoc projects than have evolved in Natomas, such as the Sankey Setback levee and erosion work at RM 78.1 and they have been rolled into the Natomas Minimum Plan. The Corps of Engineers has begun a general re-evaluation report (GRR) and had targeted completion of the report in early 2007. With the COE process they would not be ready to begin construction until before 2009 or 2010. SAFCA would like to go forward sooner. The goal is to address the highest priorities by implementing SAFCA financed improvements in a way that is compatible with the long-term plan of 200-year protection for the Natomas area. SAFCA will use a phased approach to facilitate the Natomas Minimum Plan of 200-year flood protection. SAFCA will use Northwest Hydraulic Consultants to evaluate and prioritize repairs of erosion on the east levee of the Sacramento River. The goal is develop a long-term plan to use low cost environmentally friendly measures until erosion progresses to the point that it meets the criteria for the more costly higher priority work. In addition to evaluating the levee erosion SAFCA will be looking at the under-levee seepage issue. The final study will be on levee height. The first priority will be to collect all the data, then review the alternatives for repair, all the while looking at the long-term goal of 200-year flood protection. SAFCA staff hopes to come back to

the Board in November with their findings and focus on selecting a preferred alternative and begin construction in 2007.

Peter Buck is the supervisor of the Sand Cove Park Project design team which will combine bank protection and mitigation in an effort to complete bank protection projects in an environmentally sensitive manner. Sand Cove, a park owned by the City and a cultural resource will be the first project. It is a 65/35 federal/non-federal cost share. The city and SAFCA will contribute and SAFCA would like RD 1000 to participate in the remaining cost share. The design of the project at Sand Cove is a balance between engineering and protecting sensitive cultural resources. The project will be mitigation neutral and relatively low cost.

After discussion Mr. Buck was directed to come back to the board with a more complete project and costs analysis.

#### 6) Engineer's Report

Trustee Miller stated that he has a tentative meeting scheduled with Ray Tretheway on April 29<sup>th</sup> at 10 am. Mr. Tretheway will attempt to have Mayor Fargo at the meeting to discussion the District's report on common area use of District property.

Trustee Miller further stated that he and District Engineer Clifton met with the Beezer Homes, their engineer and other community members to discuss the bike trail on the Main Drain. The District Engineer and Trustee Miller informed Beezer Homes that they would support a 4 foot chain fence two feet off the maintenance road to delineate the bike trail. The Urbanization Committee believes that a 4 foot chain fence be installed along the bike trails for safety and liability reasons.

District Engineer Clifton stated that he has received a proposal from Bob Murray & Associates to recruit a replacement District Engineer. Bob Murray & Associates was recommended by Bill Edgar. The cost is approximately the same as the prior proposal from CPS. District Engineer Clifton stated that he will review the references of each and come back to the board at the next meeting with a recommendation.

Trustee Barandas announced that he has taken a position as the Operations Manager for RD 108 and will be moving at some point.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.







#### 2B) EXPENDITURE REPORT-April 2005

The expenditures for the month of April 2005 were \$129,910.44. Warrants 723 & 7232 were issued in the amount of \$200,000.00.

#### 4A) SAND COVE PROJECT

Tim Washburn from SAFCA reviewed the proposed Sand Cove improvement project with the board. This will be a joint project with the City of Sacramento Parks and Recreation Department, and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to implement a long term solution to problems of bank erosion and looting on the Native American burial site at Sand Cove. The preliminary estimate for the project is \$750,000, with a local share of \$262,500.00. The City of Sacramento will act as the non-federal sponsor and would like SAFCA and the District to

contribute \$60,000 each to help meet the local cost share. The SAFCA board approved the requested contribution at its April board meeting. The project is scheduled for approval by the City Council on May 3, 2005. The Sand Cove project presents an opportunity to show good-will to the resource agencies because it is an environmentally friendly project.

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Christophel to authorize the district to contribute on-fourth of the non-federal cost not to exceed \$60,000. Seconded by Trustee Chase, duly put and carried.

#### **Closed Session**

The board convened in closed session pursuant to Government Code 54956.9 (c)

No action was taken during the closed session.

#### 3) Committee Reports

Trustee Chase stated that the Urbanization Committee and staff met with Councilman Tretheway to discuss the Akiyama plan for joint use of District facilities. The committee stressed that flood control is the District's primary concern but where feasible they would be willing to allow for joint use of District property. Councilman Tretheway seemed interested in the plan and the next step will be to put together a larger meeting.

Trustee Christophel stated that part of the message conveyed by the Committee is that the District is willing to take a comprehensive look at joint flood control/recreation use of District property.

#### 4A) Cata Subdivision Easement Acceptance

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that SAFCA neglected to obtain a small easement where work was done in 1994. The adjacent property owner filled his lot with two feet of fill and blocked the drainage of the southerly lot. The owner is granting easements to the District for drainage purposes in order to process a subdivision map.

Motion by Trustee Lauppe to accept the easement as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Christophel, duly put and carried.

#### 4B) LAFCO - Election

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Christophel to vote for Elliot Mulberg for Special District Representative (Office No.7) and for Tom Barandas for Alternate Special District Representative (Alternate Office No. 6 and Office No.7). Seconded by Trustee Chase, duly put and carried.

#### 5) Engineer's Report

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the proposals received from the two recruiting firms to look for a District Engineer are nearly identical in cost and scope of work.

After discussion Trustee Harris suggested that the two firms be interviewed in open session at the June board meeting. The District Engineer was directed to set an appointment time for each firm at the June meeting.

District Engineer Clifton stated that the office repair is underway, the roof work is being done and he estimates that the sheet rock will be done in three to five weeks.

The District is still going through the permit process for the bank protection project at the leaning pump house and estimates that the work will begin August 15<sup>th</sup>.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.

#### GRANT OF PERPETUAL EASEMENT FOR FLOOD CONTROL WORKS

PETE CATA AND LIDIA M. CATA, husband and wife as joint tenants, hereinafter referred to as Grantor, grants to RECLAMATION DISTRICT NUMBER 1000, a reclamation district created by act of the legislature of the State of California, approved April 8, 1911, hereinafter referred to as Grantee, its successors and assigns, a non-exclusive perpetual right of way and easement ("Easement") in that certain real property situated in the County of Sacramento, State of California, described as set forth in Exhibit "A" and shown on Exhibit "B" as "Flood Control Works Easement", both attached hereto, ("Easement Area") for use in connection with any existing or future flood control project:

- f. Locate or relocate public utility facilities by Grantee or others.
- g. Plant trees, shrubs and other vegetation in the Easement Area and preserve and maintain such vegetation growth as may be desirable for project purposes.
- h. Ingress to and egress from the Easement Area for the purpose of exercising and performing all rights and privileges granted herein.
- i. Flow over, upon and across, without recourse by the Grantors for compensation for past, present or future damage therefrom, any and all waters which may, as the result of any present or future flood control or drainage project, from time to time inundate the Easement Area.

- 2. <u>Prohibitions</u>. Grantor shall not erect, construct or maintain any residential, commercial, industrial, recreational or agricultural building or structure in the Easement Area.
- Drainage of Lots 14 and 15. As a condition of approval for the development of Grantor's property adjacent to the Easement Area, Grantor will be required to grant a private drainage easement (the "Private Drainage Easement") to the owners of Lots 14 and 15, as said lots are shown on the plat of "Gardenlend No.2" filed at the Office of the Recorder of Sacramento County in Book 18 of Maps, Map No. 70. The Private Drainage Easement will include the Easement Area described herein. Grantee will provide for drainage of surface waters that may drain to the Easement Area from Lots 14 and 15, consistent with the provisions of the Private Drainage Easement that will be granted by Grantor, subject to the rights of Grantee to reconfigure the drainage facilities as required to maintain the flood control works constructed within the Easement Area.
- 4. <u>Assignment</u>. This Easement and the rights and privileges granted herein shall be assignable,

- in whole or in part, by Grantee to the Sacramento and San Joaquin Drainage District.
- 5. No Waiver. Nothing herein shall be considered a waiver of the State Reclamation Board's power under sections 8700-8723 of the California Water Code or of Title 23 of the California Code of Regulations or of the police power of the State of California and Grantee, or of the authority vested in Grantee by law. The exercise of the rights and privileges granted herein shall be subject to applicable Federal and State flood control regulations for the encroachment upon, and operation and maintenance of, flood control works.
- 6. <u>Claims for Compensation</u>. Grantor does hereby waive all claims for any and all compensation for and on account of the location, establishment, construction, reconstruction repair, operation and maintenance of flood control works in the Easement Area in accordance with the provisions hereof. The consideration received by Grantor is in full payment for this Easement and the rights and privileges in the Easement Area, as well as for all damage past, present or future, which Grantor's remaining property may suffer by reason of the severance of the Easement Area and also from the use of the Easement Area for flood control and associated purposes.
- 7. <u>Costs of Enforcement</u>. If any action at law or equity, including any action for declaratory relief, is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Easement, each party to the litigation shall bear its own attorney's fees and costs.
- 8. <u>Recordation</u>. Grantee shall promptly record this Easement in the official records of the County of Sacramento, State of California, and may re-record it at any time as may be required to preserve its rights under this Easement.
- 9. <u>Amendment</u>. This Easement may be amended only with the express written consent of Grantor and Grantee. Any amendment to this Easement shall be recorded in the official records of the County of Sacramento, State of California.
- 10. <u>Controlling Law</u>. The interpretation and performance of this Easement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California and applicable Federal laws.
- 11. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Easement, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances, is found to be invalid, the remainder of the provisions of this Easement, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is found to be invalid, as the case may be, shall not be affected thereby.
- 12. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This instrument sets forth the entire agreement of Grantor and Grantee with respect to the Easement and supersedes all prior discussions, negotiations, understandings, or agreements relating to the Easement.
- 13. <u>Successors</u>. The covenants, terms, conditions, and restrictions of this Easement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the Parties hereto and their respective successors

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and assigns and shall continue as a servitude running in perpetuity. The terms "Grantor" and "Grantee," wherever used herein, and any pronouns used in place thereof, shall include, respectively, the above-named Grantor and its successors and assigns, and the above-named Grantee and its successors and assigns.

- 14. <u>Termination of Rights and Obligations</u>. A Party's rights and obligations under this Easement terminate upon transfer of the Party's interest in the Easement, except that liability for acts or omissions occurring prior to transfer shall survive transfer.
- 15. <u>Captions</u>. The captions in this Easement are provided solely for convenience of reference and are not part of this Easement and shall have no effect on its construction or interpretation.
- 16. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Easement may be executed in counterparts, which shall, in the aggregate, be signed by Grantor and Grantee.



## AGREEMENT BETWEEN RECLAMATION DISTRICT 1000 AND THE CITY OF SACRAMENTO FOR SHARING THE NON-FEDERAL COST CONTRIBUTION TO THE SAND COVE PARK STREAMBANK EHANCEMENT PROJECT

This agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into on the 13th day of May, 2005 by and between Reclamation District 1000, a reclamation district created by act of the legislature of the State of California, approved April 8, 1911, ("RD 1000") and the City of Sacramento, a charter municipal corporation ("City").

Whereas, RD 1000 and City are currently collaborating with the U. S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) and the Sacramento Area Flood Control Agency (SAFCA) to design and construct bank protection improvements along the east bank of the Sacramento River at approximately river mile 62.0 adjacent to the City's Sand Cove Park (Project); and

Whereas, the Project is urgently needed to protect significant Native American artifacts buried at the site that are currently subject to damage due to erosion and looting; and

Whereas, the proposed use of substantial bioengineering treatments as part of the Project design presents an opportunity to enhance the environmental value of the site, offset the impacts of future bank protection projects in the Sacramento River corridor, and develop treatment concepts that might be applied at other sites in the corridor; and

Whereas, the Corps has authority under Section 14 of the Flood Control Act of 1946 to construct the proposed improvements provided that the total cost of the Project does not exceed \$1,000,000 and there is a non-federal agency willing to bear 35 percent of the total cost of the Project; and

Whereas, City has indicated its willingness to act as the non-federal sponsor and to enter into a project cost sharing agreement with the Corps to provide the non-federal cost contribution, which is estimated to be approximately \$263,000, and to accept responsibility for the operation and maintenance of the Project upon it s completion; and

Whereas, City's willingness to act as the non-federal sponsor is in part based on the assumption that RD 1000 and SAFCA will aid the City in providing the non-federal cost contribution.

Now therefore, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Assurances</u>. City shall act as non-federal sponsor of the Project and shall provide the assurances of non-federal cooperation required by the Corps as set forth in the Project Cooperation Agreement (PCA) between the Department of the Army and the City attached as Exhibit A. These assurances include:

- a. City shall pay the nonfederal share (35 %) of the total Project cost, consisting of cash and non-cash contributions as provided in the PCA.
- b. City shall furnish to the Corps the lands, easements, rights of way, and relocations and disposal areas necessary for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the Project.
- c. Upon completion of the Project or any functional portion thereof, City shall assume responsibility for operation and maintenance of the completed portion.
- 2. <u>Contract Review</u>. City shall give RD 1000 the opportunity to review and comment on all contracts to be carried out in connection with the Project, including relevant plans and specifications, prior to the issuance of invitations for hid.
- 3. <u>RD 1000 Contribution</u>. RD 1000 shall pay City a cash contribution equal to 25 percent of the non-federal share of the cost of the Project, up to a maximum of \$60,000, to aid in the design and construction of the Project. Payment of this amount in a lump sum or series of payments shall be made within 30 days of receipt of an invoice(s) from City. The invoice(s) shall indicate the amount of contributions to be made by City pursuant to Articles II E and VI of the PCA. Such contributions shall equal or exceed twice the amount of the invoice to RD 1000.
- 4. Maintenance of Records. Within 60 days of the date of this Agreement, City and RD 1000 shall develop procedures for keeping books, records, documents and other evidence pertaining to costs and expenses incurred pursuant to this Agreement to the extent and in such detail as will properly reflect total Project costs. City and RD 1000 shall maintain such books, records, documents, and other evidence in accordance with these procedures and for a minimum of three years after completion of Project construction and resolution of all relevant claims arising therefrom, and shall make available at their offices at reasonable times, such books, records, documents, and other evidence for inspection and audit by authorized representatives of the parties to this Agreement.
- 5. <u>Final Accounting</u>. Upon completion or termination of the Project, City and RD 1000 shall each prepare an accounting of all costs incurred and credits claimed hereunder. This accounting shall be tabulated by City and used in reaching a final accounting with the Corps for creditable Project costs.
- 6. Obligation of Future Appropriations. RD 1000 has currently appropriated sufficient funds to make the contribution specified in Paragraph 3. Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute, or be deemed to constitute, an obligation of future appropriations by the City Council of Sacramento or the Board of Directors of RD 1000.



- 7. Term of Agreement; Amendment. The term of this Agreement shall be coextensive with that of the PCA, and shall become effective on the date first written above. This Agreement may be amended only upon written consent of the parties.
- 8. <u>Notices</u>. All notices, requests, demands, and other communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be deemed to have been duly given if in writing and delivered personally or mailed by first-class (postage pre-paid), registered, or certified mail, as follows:

A party may change the address to which such communications are to be directed by giving written notice to the other party in the manner provided in this section.

Any notice, request, demand, or other communication made pursuant to this Paragraph shall be deemed to have been received by the addressee at such time as it is personally delivered or three calendar days after it is mailed, as the case may be.

#### 9. Indemnification.

- a. City shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless RD 1000, its Board, officers, directors, agents and employees from and against all demands, claims, actions, liabilities, losses, damages, and costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Agreement, or from the construction, operation, maintenance, repair, replacement, and rehabilitation of the Project, caused in whole or in part by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of City's officers, directors, agents, employees, volunteers or contractors.
- b. RD 1000 shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless City, its officers, directors, agents, and employees from and against all demands, claims, actions, liabilities, losses, damages and costs, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of or resulting from the performance of the Agreement, caused in whole or in part by the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of to RD 1000's Board, officers, directors, agents, employees, volunteers or contractors.
- 10. <u>Insurance or Self-Insurance</u>. Each party, at its sole cost and expense, shall carry insurance or self-insure its activities in connection with this Agreement, and obtain, keep in force and maintain, insurance or equivalent programs of self-insurance, for general liability, workers compensation and business automobile liability adequate to cover its potential liabilities hereunder. Each party agrees to provide the other thirty (30)

days' advance written notice of any cancellation, termination or lapse of any of the insurance or self-insurance coverages.

- 11. Severability. If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid or unenforceable by any court of final jurisdiction, it is the intent of the parties that all other provisions of this Agreement be construed to remain fully valid, enforceable, and binding on the parties.
- 12. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of City and RD 1000 and supercedes any prior written or oral agreement between them concerning the subject matter herein. Any subsequent amendments, modifications, or waivers of this Agreement must be in writing and signed by the authorized representative of both parties.

#### RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE PROCEEDING WITH STREAMBANK PROTECTION PROJECT AT SAND COVE PARK

WHEREAS, the City originally identified the need for Riverbank Stabilization at Sand Cove Park in 2001 and has been actively seeking additional funding since that time for capital improvements to protect cultural and natural resources at the site;

WHEREAS, the Sacramento District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) has completed a Preliminary Design Analysis for Sand Cove Park under the Section 14 Emergency Stream Bank Protection Program, whose purpose is to protect public infrastructure and cultural resources. This Analysis concluded that a federal interest to identify and implement a cost-effective solution is warranted. The Corps has further determined that the proposed project qualifies for funding under this program;

WHEREAS, the Corps has identified sufficient federal funding under the Emergency Stream Bank Protection Program to contribute 65 percent of total project costs up to a maximum of \$1,000,000 in federal contribution;

WHEREAS, the City agrees to serve as the local, non-federal sponsor as the site's property owner, and agrees to the terms and conditions of the Project Cooperation Agreement to be executed by the Corps and City, providing 35 percent of total project cost;

WHEREAS, the City wishes to partner with other local agencies in project design and implementation, including payment by such other agencies of a share of the required nonfederal funding in accordance with an agreements between the City and these other agencies:

District Engineer Clifton reviewed work done by Jack Buckley in November 2000. It appears that development can be accommodated with increased capacity at one or more pumps without building new facilities.

The annual California Central Valley luncheon and meeting will be held on June 23. David Christophel expressed interest in attending the meeting and luncheon with District Engineer Clifton.

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) is planning to construct a 12kV overhead power line to serve the Natomas Mutual Water District – Airport Pump Station Project located at 5192 Bayou Way in the North Natomas Area of Sacramento County. The route planned for the needed electrical facilities crosses property owned by Reclamation District No.1000, identified as APN: 225-0010-012, Lot 38 of Natomas Riverside Subdivision No.3, 15 BM 43.

SMUD requires a Temporary Right of Way across the property identified above, for access, to construct, place, remove, replace, use and maintain electrical facilities consisting of aerial wires, and cables, with associated poles, transformers capacitors, switches, anchors and all necessary fixtures and appurtenances needed for the delivery of services, within the following route described in the attached Exhibit A and illustrated in red on the attached Exhibit-B and B1. No poles will be located within the route.

It is intended that this temporary service line remain in place until the area is developed. At that time, the power line will be removed and replaced by a permanent power system in accordance with the SMUD's rules and regulations. All removals are to be performed at SMUD's expense.

This letter serves as the non-recordable instrument and documents the Temporary of Right of Way, inclusive of the attached Addendum, "Reclamation District No. 1000 Standard Easement Provisions", granted by Reclamation District No. 1000 to SMUD.



The California Central Valley Flood Control Association is very involved in the process and has hired a lobbyist to work on behalf of the flood control agencies. The driving force

behind the legislation is lack of funds from the State governments for flood control projects and inverse condemnation liability costs.

District Engineer asked Counsel to prepare a document for the board on the District's ability to raise funds for capital improvement projects. Counsel has prepared the document for the board's information and use. District Engineer Clifton stated that FEMA is updating the FIRM maps and at up some point, decertifying the District's Sacramento River levee will come up.



#### **ANCOME ADOPTED BUDGET 2003/2004**

The property assessments shown are based on actual collections plus an estimate to be collected between 4/10/05 and 6/30/05. Also included are the assessments collected through the Sacramento County Teeter Plan of \$25,39.64.56 for the 2003/2004 assessments. The estimate of unpaid collections at June 30 to be collected through the Teeter Plan is \$11,036.15.

#### **INCOME PROPOSED 2005/2006**

The operation and maintenance income proposed is based on average income over three years (2001-2003). However, the Property Assessment shown is based on the estimate actual assessment proposed for fiscal year 2005/2006 maintaining a .75 rate of assessment but not yet adjusted for land use changes. This amount was provided by Shilts Consultants. This is the eighth year that the rate will not be increased. The interest income is based on the actual collected for 2004/2005 rather than the average due to the disparity in the interest earned this year as compared to the prior years. The interest income proposed is based on current rates of return on funds and lower balances maintained in the funds, and may increase or decrease depending on the changes in the economic environment.

The capital income proposed is interest based on estimate of rate of return and on the purchase of the 2004 Jeep by the District Engineer.

No income is proposed for Rights of Way, Easement or Drainage Fees. This income is sporadic and unpredictable.

#### **EXPENSES ADOPTED BUDGET 2004/2005**

Liability/Auto Insurance – The adopted budget for Liability and Auto Insurance was based on the prior year. The actual cost of insurance for 2004/2005 was substantially higher than anticipated.

Office Equipment – Nothing was budgeted for new office equipment for 2004/2005, however, due to the fire, some equipment was purchased to facilitate staff in the temporary location, including a file cabinet and typewriter.

Field Services - Increase costs in water quality testing account for the majority of the overage on this account.

Equipment Repair/Service – The overage in this account is due to the replacement of the transmission in Mower #019 and the hydraulic work done on the excavator to accommodate the new mower head.

Power – Due to a dry winter the power costs for the district were low. This should not indicate a reduction is needed in the power budget. With a dry year the cost of power still exceeded fifty percent of the budgeted amount, and in a wet year this item would have been significantly over budget.

Wage - The overage in wages is due to unbudgeted overtime.

Plant 1B Advance Funding – This represents a portion of the approved maximum \$750,000 advance funding to the city for the completion of the Plant 1B project. The majority of this was expended last year, with \$226,947 available in this fiscal year. Only a small portion of that was needed. No further expenses on this project are anticipated. All homeowners have been paid, with the exception of two, and the time frame for filing claims has expired.

#### EXPENSES PROPOSED BUDGET - 2005/2006

The Operation and Maintenance expenses proposed are based on the three year average of expenses, or on the current year expense with the exception of Field Services which includes an additional \$25,000 for hiring the Sacramento Conservation Corp for levee clean up, and an increase for the costs of NPDES requirements. The cost of a recruiting firm is estimated at \$24,000 and this amount has been added to the "Other" category.

The exceptions to the three year average are as follows:

Group Insurance - The proposed amount is based on the projected increase in actual costs. The average increase is 8.7% which is substantially lower than increases in the last three years.

Worker's Compensation – The workers compensation rate is based on the proposed wage schedule and does not reflect any increases in the rates the district pays.

→ension –The personnel committee approved a change in the retirement contract from 2% @ 60 to 2% @ 55 pending a valuation report from CalPers. As of July 1, all public agencies were placed in pooled funds. This change is reflected in an increase from the current 6.623% employer rate to 12.5%. The amount budgeted is based on the proposed wages, and a 12.5 % rate.

Election Costs –An election of District trustees will be held in November. \$10,000 has been budgeted for this expense.

Power - The actual cost for power for 2004/2005 is more than fifty percent of the amount budgeted. No increase in the power budget is recommended but a decrease in this budget item is discouraged. The amount budged of \$650,000.00 allows for only a little over \$200,000 in the event of a storm. If the district were to experience a wet year, as in 1986, 1993 or 1996 it would not be unreasonable to expect to see the power cost jump to more than a million dollars.

# 1A) Regular Meeting –July 15, 2005

Motion by Trustee Lauppe to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held July 15, 2005 as presented. Seconded by Trustee Barandas, duly put and carried.

Motion by Trustee Christophel to approve the Treasurer's Report for July 2005 as presented. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

# 2B) EXPENDITURE REPORT-July 2005

The expenditures for the month of July 2005 were \$320,353.75. Warrants 7234 and 7235 were issued in the amount of \$200,000.00.

#### 3) COMMITTEE REPORTS

There were no committee meetings.

Trustee Christophel stated that he would like the board to think about how to advertise the election, though it may be late to discuss if for the upcoming election they should consider how to advertise and get the word out for future elections.

Staff stated that currently the notice of nominating petition filing is being advertised in the Sacramento Bee and the Appeals Democrat and a notice will be posted on the website.

Trustee Harris suggested that public relations become a part of the Urbanization Committee and that they consider how to inform the public of district activities such as the election of trustees. Thom Gilbert was appointed to fill the vacancy on the Urbanization Committee.

Trustee Christophel stated that Senate Bill 1665 has been discussed at the SAFCA staff meetings and he believes the District should let constituents know that if passed more of the costs of improvements on District levees will become local costs.

# 4A) AGREEMENT TERMINATION

District Engineer Clifton stated that in the 1970's during the development of the Northgate Business Park several detention pond agreements were made between the property owners and the District. Since then the C-1 Canal and Plant 8 were constructed to handle the drainage from the area the detention ponds are no longer needed. None exist at this time, but the agreements are still a part of the recorded documents on the land. The District has received a request to terminate the detention pond agreement on several parcels. Counsel has reviewed the termination agreement and the District Engineer recommends terminating the agreements.

Motion by Trustee Barandas to terminate the detention pond agreements as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

# 4B) EASEMENT REQUEST

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the City of Sacramento is building a water tank on the south-east corner of Elkhorn Blvd. and the East Drain. They are requesting a twenty foot easement for a water line under the East Drain to deliver water west of Elkhorn. Counsel has reviewed the easement document and District Engineer Clifton recommends granting the easement.

Motion by Trustee Miller to grant the easement for a water line under the East Drain as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Christophel, duly put and carried.

# 4C) SAND COVE ADDITIONAL COST REQUEST

District Engineer Clifton stated that the original project was for 400 feet in length and it has been expanded to 700 feet.

John Bassett from SAFCA explained that the original estimate for the project was from a Corps of Engineers (COE) Feasibility Study two years ago. When the project was actually reviewed it was determined that 700 feet would need to be done. The construction specifications are for payment on a per ton basis. The West El Camino Truck stop has been selected to weigh the trucks.

Tim Washburn of SAFCA stated that the Feds have still not appropriated the funds and they don't have a firm commitment from the COE. They are looking for the funds. This will be about a two month project.

Trustee Harris asked what the odds were that SAFCA would be back before the project is completed for more money. John Bassett stated that was unlikely.

Jim Miller asked why there was such a large increase in the cost estimate for Planning/Design and Analysis.

Mr. Washburn stated that SAFCA did the preliminary design work and it has now been turned over to the design engineering firm. This project is to develop new technology to manage erosion offering bank protection and increased habitat value. As the technique is perfected the costs of such projects may come down, but this kind of project is being developed to reduce the cost of offsite mitigation. Currently the alternatives are rip-rap, setback levees or widening of levees. All have mitigation costs and in some areas setback levees or widening is not an option.

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Christophel to approve the requested increase of \$47,362.50 as the District's share for the Sand Cove project. Seconded by Trustee Barandas, duly put and carried; Trustee Miller recused himself due to a possible conflict of interest.

# 5) Engineer's Report

Trustee Harris asked if there was any benefit to the district stocking its canals with mosquito fish. District Engineer Clifton stated that it is already done by the Vector District

District Engineer Clifton stated that he believes we will be back in the District office for the next board meeting scheduled on September 16, 2005.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.

#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

District entered into (i) that certain "Short Form Agreement" dated March 7, 1973 recorded as Instrument No. 23143, Book 730314, Page 650 of Official Records, Sacramento

County, California ("Short Form Agreement"); and (ii) that certain Agreement dated August 31, 1973 recorded as Instrument No. 85083, Book 730831, Page 965 of Official Records, Sacramento County, California ("Agreement"). The Short Form Agreement and Agreement are referred to herein, collectively, as the "Ponded Storage Agreements."

The Ponded Storage Agreements require that owners of the Property construct and maintain drainage water ponds for the purpose of retarding and regulating drainage water flows into the District's drainage system. In exchange for such construction and maintenance, the District agreed to receive drainage waters into its drainage system.

The District acknowledges and agrees that the Ponded Storage Agreements and the requirements thereunder are no longer required since the regulation of drainage water flowing into the District's drainage system has been otherwise addressed. Accordingly, the area in which the Property is located no longer requires the construction, existence or maintance of a detention pond.

The District now desires to revoke, terminate and release any rights that it may have with respect to the Ponded Storage Agreements to the extent that it affects the Property.

#### **TERMS**

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, District, on behalf of itself and its successors and assigns does hereby revoke and terminate the Ponded Storage Agreement and forever release all rights and obligations thereunder. Notwithstanding any language to the contrary contained herein, in no event shall this Termination prevent, or otherwise extinguish the rights of any current or future owners of the Property from depositing drainage waters into the District's drainage system in accordance with any other agreements, easements or other similar documents entered into by and between such owners and the District.

AGREEMENT FOR ACQUISITION OF MINOR EASEMENT (No Compensation)

WHEREAS, the above-named Grantor(s) (hereafter referred to as the "Grantor") own the real property (hereafter referred to as the "Property") described in the easement deed attached hereto as Exhibit "A" (hereafter referred to as the "Easement Deed"); and

WHEREAS, Grantor desires to convey and the City of Sacramento (hereafter referred to as the "City") desires to acquire an easement (hereafter referred to as the "Easement") as described in the Easement Deed, on the terms and conditions set forth herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the rights and obligations set forth below, Grantor and City mutually agree as follows:

- 1. No Compensation. Grantor is conveying the Easement to City for no compensation. Grantor expressly agrees that performance of this Agreement by City shall constitute full and fair consideration for Grantor's conveyance of the Easement to City, and Grantor expressly waives any and all rights to compensation or payment therefore, and, further, waives any and all claims that Grantor may have against City other than as expressly set forth herein by reason of the City's acquisition, improvement, possession or occupancy of the Property, including without limitation claims for severance or taking compensation, or damages on account of the acquisition of the Property or the location, establishment, construction or operation of the above-named project on the Property. The foregoing waivers shall include any and all rights or claims that Grantor may have under Article 1, section 19 of the California Constitution, the Eminent Domain Law, or any other law or regulation.
- 2. Conveyance. Upon execution of this Agreement by both parties, Grantor shall execute and deliver to City for recording the Easement Deed and shall convey the Easement to the City. Grantor represents, but does not warrant that there are no leases, license, permit, option, right of first refusal or other agreement, written or oral, which affects the Easement. City shall satisfy itself as to the validity and condition of Grantor's title to the property on which this Easement is granted and as to the existence of any liens, encumbrances or defects thereto.
- **3. Grantor's Ownership.** Grantor certifies that it has full power and authority to convey all property rights described herein to City.
- 4. Possession and Use of the Easement. The City shall have the right of possession and

use of the Easement including the right to remove and dispose of improvements and construct the above-named project commencing on the date that this Agreement is executed by both parties; provided that City makes no representation that the project shall be constructed, and no liability or obligation whatsoever shall be incurred by City by reason of any failure to construct the project for any reason. If the Easement subsequently is not acquired by City for any reason, City shall restore the Easement to the condition existing prior to the City's possession or use hereunder, unless otherwise agreed by the parties. City intends to install a water transmission line or lines beneath District's canal on the property over which this Easement is granted by boring at least five feet beneath the canal bottom. City shall provide to Grantor for its prior review and approval plans and specifications for installation of City facilities within this Easement, and shall thereafter install such facilities in accordance with such approved plans and specifications. City shall be responsible to Grantor for any and all damages caused to Grantor's facilities in the course of installation, operation or maintenance of City's facilities within the granted Easement.

- 5. Indemnification. Each party (hereafter the "Indemnifying Party") agrees and covenants to indemnify, defend (with counsel acceptable to the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld), and hold the other party, and its officers, employees and agents, harmless from and against any and all liabilities, penalties, losses, damages, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees, whether for outside or staff counsel), causes of action, claims, or judgments that arise by reason of any acts or omissions related to the performance of this Agreement or the occupancy or use of the Property, by the Indemnifying Party, its officers, employees, agents or any other person or entity employed by or acting on their behalf. The provisions of this Section 5 shall survive the recording of any deeds hereunder.
- 6. Binding on Successors; Recording. This Agreement shall be binding on and shall inure to the benefit of the City and Grantor, and their respective successors, assigns, and their past, present and future officers, employees and agents; provided that this Agreement may only be assigned with the written consent of both parties, and any attempt to assign this Agreement without such consent shall be void. # EASEMENT FOR WATER LINE

Reclamation District No. 1000, a reclamation district created by act of the legislature of the State of California, approved April 8, 1911



### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

### 1A) Regular Meeting –August 19 2005

Motion by Trustee Christophel to approve the minutes of the regular meeting held August 19, 2005 as presented. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

## 2A) Treasurer's Report – August 2005

The Treasurer's Report for August 2005 is as follows:

Motion by Trustee Barandas to approve the Treasurer's Report for August 2005 as presented. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

# 2B) EXPENDITURE REPORT- August 2005

The expenditures for the month of August 2005 were \$348,630.81. Warrants 7236 and 7237 were issued in the amount of \$200,000.00.

# 3) COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance Committee

Trustee Harris stated that the finance committee met on Thursday, September 15, 2005 with staff and the auditor, Jean Foster, to review the draft financial statements.

Trustee Gilbert stated that the audit was reviewed and that the audit had been thorough despite the fact that access to all records was not easy due to the office fire.

#### 4A) Presentation to Board

Richard Willey, a property owner in the District, addressed the board regarding his concern over flood control. Mr. Willey stressed that in his opinion the Auburn Dam needed to be revisited. He believes that the Auburn Dam will be built, but not perhaps before Sacramento floods. He would like to see dialogue begun regarding the Auburn Dam. The levees are not enough to protect the changing community as it goes from agricultural to urban use. More people need to be made aware of the need for an Auburn Dam and the various agencies should work together toward that goal.

Trustee Harris stated that he was as concerned about flooding in the region as Mr. Willey but that now is not the time to look at an Auburn Dam. Several projects are awaiting approval by congress and if it appears that the locals are not united on which projects to do none of them will get funding. There may be merit to looking into the Auburn Dam issue, but politically it is not feasible for this agency to take a stand on it at this time.

Trustee Christophel stated that Mr. Willey's concerns about the risk of flooding are real and he shares those concerns, however, he believes this District needs to focus on what flood control improvements have the greatest potential of being approved and completed.

Trustee Miller stated that he listened to the Corps of Engineers at the last SAFCA meeting and that there are a lot of projects they would like to do but the don't have the money and are having difficulty getting the funding for projects that are already approved.

#### 4B) Easement Quit Claim Request – R & B Communities

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that Reynen & Bardis Communities has requested a quit claim on the C-2 drain on the JMA North Natomas property. The District has quit claimed sections north and south of this location on the C-2 drain and has no need for the drain. Future runoff will be collected in the City underground drainage system.

Motion by Trustee Miller to grant the quit claim as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Christophel, duly put and carried.

#### 4A) Presentation to Board

Butch Hodgkins from SAFCA reported to the board on the Natomas Levee Evaluation SAFCA is currently conducting. This is the third phase of a three phase study. SAFCA would like to work closely with RD 1000 as the levees being evaluated belong to the District. SAFCA and RD 1000 undertook the North Area Local Project to provide minimum 100 year protection for Natomas. The levees were certified but later under levee seepage became an issue. New criteria was developed by the Corps of Engineers for certifying levees in 2004 and if the District levees were evaluated using the new criteria it is questionable if they could be certified. The District's Engineer, Jim Clifton has been bringing the

problem of erosion to the table for a number of years. The SAFCA Natomas Levee evaluation will look at under levee seepage, bank erosion and evaluate the levees against the 2004 COE criteria.

Mr. Hodgkins stated that when the data from the borings taken for the evaluation begins to come in he would like to come back to the board with the engineers to report their findings. Mr. Hodgkins will return to the October meeting to review erosion and hydraulics, and to the November meeting to discuss under levee seepage. In December or January they will be looking at alternatives for levee improvements.

## 4C) JOINT USE REQUEST

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that XO California, Inc. has requested a joint use agreement to place a new fiber optic line under the District's C-1 canal at National Drive. The fiber optic line will be directionally drilled fifteen feet below the canal.

Motion by Trustee Gilbert to approve grant the joint use agreement as outlined by staff and reviewed by counsel. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

### 4D) MITIGATION LAND - HUNTING LEASE RENEWAL

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the District owns 159 acres of mitigation land, jointly, with RD 900 in Yolo County. The two districts executed a hunting lease in 1999 and one of the lessee's has requested a five year extension. The two districts proportionally share the expense and income of the property. The lessee pays some of the pumping costs to keep water in the lake for duck hunting. Additionally the lessee lives on the adjacent property and provides physical security and performs a significant amount of maintenance. Attorney Day has prepared the lease extension and the RD 900 board approved the lease renewal at their regular meeting this month.

Trustee Miller recused himself from discussion.

Trustee Christophel asked if the district was protected from liability. District Engineer Clifton stated that the lessee is required to name the two Districts as additionally insured on his liability policy.

Motion by Trustee Gilbert to approve the lease extension as outlined by staff and prepared by counsel. Seconded by Trustee Barandas, duly put and carried.

# 4E) JOINT USE REQUEST - Gateway Self Storage Bike Trail

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the City of Sacramento required the developers of the Gateway Self Storage project to construct a bike trail as a condition of approval for the project. The bike trail as proposed will encroach four feet onto District property adjacent to the District's C-1 canal. The self storage project is constructed with a wrought iron fence at its south and west sides. A six foot fence would need to be placed on the north side of the canal maintenance road for liability purposes to prevent someone falling in the canal,

which has a high sloped bank. The fencing would form a 1,200 foot long "tunnel" and present obvious safety issues. District Engineer Clifton recommended denying the request and urging them to seek an on street alternative.

Trustee Miller stated that there will be backlash from the City for denying the request. District Engineer Clifton stated that he thought the City would be concerned about the safety issue and has suggested that they ask the police chief his opinion. Trustee Gilbert stated that the argument should be made that if it isn't safe it should not be constructed.

This item was tabled without action until the safety issues are fully addressed.

# 5) Engineer's Report

#### A.) Clemmons v. RD 1000 Status

District Engineer Clifton stated that Attorney Worthington called and gave him an update on the Clemmons litigation. On November 16 there will be a meeting to hear plaintiffs claims and determine if they are reasonable. This is the first of three phases to settlement. The next meeting will be with the defendants only to determine what percentage of the liability each party has. This is basically an American River Flood Control and City of Sacramento issue, and the District should have little exposure. The third phase will be the final settlement.

# B) Emergency Bank Work Report

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that the emergency bank work was completed a few weeks ago. The ramps were left in place in case future work is requied.

### C) Office Repair Status

The repairs to the office are nearly complete and the scheduled move in date is September 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup>.

District Engineer Clifton stated that at the finance committee meeting yesterday the committee discussed the need to raise the rates to fund future levee improvements. Trustee Harris stated that he believed it prudent to be prepared to raise the rates at the least. District Engineer Clifton will be discussing the issue with counsel. The last Assessment Valuation was done in 1984 and it is probably time to have a new evaluation done.

Trustee Miller stated that the district's capital fund is \$3 million and that is earmarked for Plant 2, and is not sufficient to do the project. Trustee Harris stated that the trend is for the locals to pay a greater share of levee and flood control improvements. Trustee Gilbert stated that it would be better to invest up front and repay the debt over 30 years rather than wait.

District Engineer Clifton stated that he believed a new valuation needed to be done. The damage to agricultural land is potentially a year's crop loss, but the damage to residential and commercial property would be in the millions. District Engineer Clifton stated that he mentioned the finance committee's discussion to

Attorney Day and will be discussing the legal issues of Proposition 218. District Engineer Clifton informed the board that if an independent assessment valuation is undertaken that once it is in the hands of the valuation commission it is out of the Board's control. The commissioners will prepare the report and present it to the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors for approval. Attorney Day will prepare an opinion for review with the finance committee regarding prop. 218 issues and rate increases.

The October board meeting has been rescheduled to Tuesday, October 11, 2005 at 8 am at the District office.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.





# 4A) EASEMENT FOR SEWER – Sacramento County Sanitation District No. 1 (Promenade at Natomas)

The County of Sacramento is requesting an easement for a sewer line under the Districts East Drain on the north side of Truxel Road to connect to the main sewer line. The District prepared the subject easement documents, and the District's Standard Terms and Conditions are a part of the document

Motion by Trustee Miller to approve the easement as outlined by staff. Seconded by Trustee Lauppe, duly put and carried.

# 4B) RESOLUTION - Sacramento County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan

District Engineer Clifton informed the board Congress passed a law requiring Counties, Cities and other public agency to have a Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan to be eligible for federal reimbursements. Sacramento County was the lead agency in the development of the plan that includes cities within the county and 69 special districts. Staff participated in the plan development and recommended the Board adopt the resolution as prepared in order to remain eligible for federal disaster reimbursements.

Motion by Trustee Christophel to adopt Resolution 2005-11 as presented by staff. Seconded by Trustee Miller, duly put and carried.

#### 4C) Presentation to Board – Natomas Levee Evaluation

District Engineer Clifton informed the board that he contacted Butch Hodgkins. Mr. Hodgkins has been appointed to the State Reclamation Board and has resigned his activities at SAFCA. Rick Reinhart from MBK will probably be taking over.

Trustee Lauppe stated that someone has been doing a lot of boring and surveying around his property. District Engineer Clifton stated that it could be SAFCA or the Corps of Engineers.

Trustee Miller stated that at the presentation made at SAFCA they stated that the boring is done but it will take two years to analyze the borings.

# 5) Engineer's Report

District Engineer Clifton stated that Bob Murray & Associates has received 17 applications for the District Engineer position. Seven are qualified. A meeting has been scheduled for the board to review the qualified applicants with Regan Williams on Monday, December 5, 2005 at 3:30 pm. The meeting will be held at the District office.

Trustee Miller stated that he attended one of the Disaster preparedness meetings presented by the Mayor and Dave Brent. The meeting was informative and well put together.

Attorney Day stated that he attended a meeting with District Engineer Clifton where Tim Washburn discussed Proposition 218 election requirements. SAFCA is considering holding Proposition 218 elections to raise funds for needed flood improvements.

Trustee Christophel asked District Engineer Clifton how he saw things changing in the District and the Boards position. District Engineer Clifton stated that AB 1665, if it passes, will take the State off the hook for a lot of the work they are now responsible for, namely bank protection.

The Department of Water Resources wants the locals to maintain the banks as well as the levees. From a liability standpoint they can pass whatever laws they want, until there is a suit filed and constitutional issues are involved the matter won't be resolved.

Attorney Day stated that the State is responsible up until the law passes and there is plenty of documentation to show their liability.

Trustee Harris asked Attorney Day to review the memo he prepared for the Board on Proposition 218.

Attorney Day stated that while raising rates under Proposition 218 is problematic it is not impossible. The big issue is that if they have a 218 election no District funds can be used to campaign for it. The District can do a factual piece about the issues but not present an argument.

Trustee Christophel stated that he will schedule a meeting with the Urbanization Committee to begin work on an informative newsletter for the District. Trustee Christophel asked if the District has a formal written Flood Response Plan. District Engineer Clifton stated that all of the crew have been to DWR seminars and sand bagging workshops and the District maintains a list of contractors to contact during a flood situation.

The next regular board meeting will be held December 9, 2005 at 8:00 am at the District office.

There being no further business to come before the board, the meeting was adjourned.



#### STANDARD EASEMENT PROVISIONS

- 1. Easement Non-Exclusive. The easement herein granted is non-exclusive. Reclamation District No. 1000 ("RD 1000") reserves the right to grant to third parties the right to use of all or some portion of the easement area so long as any such right granted to a third party does not unreasonably interfere with exercise of the rights herein granted. It shall be presumed, as a presumption affecting the burden of proof, that any rights granted to a third party by RD 1000 within all or any portion of the easement area herein granted do not unreasonably interfere with exercise of the rights herein granted.
- 2. Superior District Rights Relocation. RD 1000 reserves the right to use the easement area for any and all reclamation district purposes, which right is hereby understood to be superior to rights to use of the easement areas as herein granted. Should it be necessary in the exercise of RD 1000s reclamation district functions to alter or relocate any of the facilities placed within or uses made in the easement area to accommodate RD 1000s reclamation district use, RD 1000 shall notify Grantee and Grantee shall reasonably promptly accomplish such alteration or relocation at Grantee's sole cost and expense, provided that RD 1000 shall provide alternate location on the lands of RD 1000 as may be necessary to relocate said easement and facilities of Grantee.
- 3. <u>Abandonment.</u> Should Grantee fail to utilize the easement area for any of the purposes herein provided for any consecutive three year period, this easement shall be conclusively presumed to have been abandoned, and Grantee shall execute and record a good and sufficient quitclaim deed in the relevant county records terminating all interests therein.
- 4. <u>Indemnity</u>. Grantee shall save and hold RD 1000 free and harmless from and shall indemnify RD 1000 against any and all costs (including reasonable attorney's fees), loss, claims, liabilities or damages arising out of Grantee's or Grantee's agent's or contractor's installation or operation of facilities in, or use of, the easement area, including all costs of environmental clean-up, remediation, inspection or investigation.
- 5. <u>Mediation and Arbitration.</u> Should any dispute arise over interpretation or enforcement of any of the terms or conditions of this easement, the parties hereto shall endeavor in good faith to resolve such disputes first by negotiation, then by mediation. If such dispute cannot be resolved by negotiation or mediation, the parties hereto agree to submit such disputes to binding arbitration, all in accordance with the following:

- a) Upon written notice by either party to the other that a dispute has arisen (which notice generally describes the subject matter of the dispute), the parties hereto shall each cause one or more directors, trustees or upper management level employees with full authority to resolve such disputes to meet and confer in a good faith attempt to resolve such dispute at least one time over the ten (10) day period immediately following the date of receipt of such notice.
- b) If the dispute is not resolved through such negotiation, either party may request appointment of a mediator by written request to the other party and to the American Arbitration Association ("AAA") in San Francisco, CA. at 417 Montgomery Street, which request shall describe the general nature of the dispute. The AAA shall appoint a single mediator acceptable to both parties (or if both parties cannot agree on acceptance of a mediator, the mediator designated by AAA) appropriate to the nature of the dispute, and the parties shall submit the dispute to mediation before such mediator within a period of twenty (20) days form the date of mailing of the written request therefore. Each party shall bear their own costs or mediation and shall share equally the cost of the mediator.
- c) If such a dispute is not resolved by mediation with a period of thirty (30) days from the date of mailing of the written request for mediation the dispute shall be resolved by binding arbitration before a single arbitrator appointed by the AAA (who shall not be the same person as the mediator) in accordance with those current arbitration rules of the AAA determined to be most applicable by AAA, given the nature of the dispute. Either party ay initiate such binding arbitration by written notice of demand for arbitration sent to the other party and to AAA at any time following conclusion of mediation, but not later than the date when institution of legal or equitable proceedings based on such dispute would be barred by the applicable statute of limitations. The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding on all parties and shall be specifically enforceable, and judgment may be entered upon such arbitrator's decision under prevailing law of any court having jurisdiction. The prevailing party in any such arbitration shall be awarded reasonable attorney's fees incurred in such arbitration against the losing party, and the losing party shall be required to pay the arbitrator's fees and expenses.
