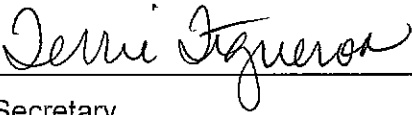

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

1A) Regular Meeting, December 12, 2008

Motion by Trustee Shiels to approve the minutes of the Regular Board meeting held December 12, 2008, as presented. Seconded by Trustee Harris, duly put and carried.

2A) Treasurer's Report – December 2008

3) COMMITTEE REPORTS

SAFCA Representatives

Trustee Shiels stated the SAFCA Executive committee met last week. SAFCA is planning to award the construction contract for Phase 2 of the NLIP in March but they still need the Corps of Engineers (COE) Permits. They also need to complete the master agreements with Sacramento County, the Natomas Basin Conservancy, Natomas Mutual Water Company and RD 1000 for operation and maintenance and the cost sharing agreement with the State. Trustee Miller stated that he was concerned about the master agreement and that is a really fast timeline, are GM Devereux and Counsel Day working on it? Attorney Day stated District staff has a draft agreement which we are working on with SAFCA, but some of the issues are complicated. GM Devereux stated they will be negotiating with SAFCA staff on the draft agreement in February and have a final agreement for execution in March. The Executive Committee also briefly discussed the COE GRR and there is some discomfort about the proposed schedule.

Executive Committee

Trustee Christophel informed the Board that the Executive Committee met to review the agenda and discussed the proposed encroachment application for an above ground fuel storage facility at Riverbank Marina and the levee inspections. General Manager Devereux stated that he was out yesterday doing levee inspections along the Garden Highway and people have been cooperative.

4A) Election of Officers – Committee Assignments

Motion by Trustee Miller to retain Trustee Christophel as President of the Board of Trustees and Trustee Shiels as Vice President. The motion was seconded by Trustee Harris, duly put and carried.

4B) Banking Resolution for signature Authority on District Accounts

Due to changes on the Board of Trustees with the appointment of Jerome Smith and the departure of Alan Lauppe the District is required to submit a new Banking Resolution to the Sacramento County Treasurer and Bank of the West for new signature authority. Banking Resolution No. 2009-01 is enclosed for approval by the Board.

Motion by Trustee Harris to approve Resolution 2009-01 as drafted. The motion was seconded by Trustee Barandas, duly put and carried. Said resolution has been made a part of these minutes.

4C) Receive and File: 2009 Investment Policy for the Pooled Investment Fund – County of Sacramento

The Board of Trustees received and filed the 2009 Investment Policy for the Pooled Investment Fund – County of Sacramento.

4D) Resolution thanking Alan Lauppe for his service as District Trustee

President Christophel thanked Alan Lauppe for his service as a District Trustee and the contributions he made to the Board. Resolution 2009-02 has been prepared to acknowledge Alan Lauppe's service to the District and the Board's appreciation of that service.

It was moved by Trustee Harris to adopt Resolution 2009-02 as presented. The motion was seconded by Trustee Shiels, duly put and carried. Said Resolution is being made a part of these minutes.

4E) Encroachment Permit – Proposed Fuel Tank and Re-fueling Facility – Riverbank Marina

General Manager Devereux informed the Board that has received an application for an encroachment permit from the owners of Riverbank Marina for a fuel storage tank and re-fueling facility. The proposed facility will include a 6000 galleon double walled tank to contain fuel to supply a re-fueling facility to be constructed on the existing parking lot structure adjacent to the Sacramento River levee. General Manager Devereux stated he had three concerns with the proposed facility. 1) Will the proposed facility impact the District's operation and maintenance activities, 2) does the facility pose a threat to the existing levee and 3) how could the facility impact the District's ability to conduct a flood fight in an emergency? GM Devereux stated that because of its location on the parking structure and off the levee proper he does not believe the facility will impact the District's operation and maintenance activities as the area is already heavily developed. Based on the proposed design and his conversations with the design engineers he does not believe the proposed facility will pose a significant threat to the levee, and finally, the area is so heavily developed at this time that a flood fight in the area would be complicated and he does not believe the proposed facility will inherently make a flood emergency response more difficult. Additionally the levee is extra wide at this location and a slurry wall is in place. GM Devereux stated based on his analysis, he believes endorsement of the proposed encroachment is more of a policy than an engineering issue. Trustee Harris asked what the basis for a policy decision might be. GM Devereux stated, the Board may decide that no more encroachments on the levees ought to be permitted, or that commercial uses in the floodway should not be permitted.

GM Devereux stated Gary Baker, from Tate Engineering and Kip Skidmore the property owner are in attendance to answer any questions the Board may have regarding the proposed facility.

Mr. Baker informed the board that the facility is designed with the highest safety and environmental protection features in place. Trustee Miller asked if the tank would be steel construction. Mr. Baker stated it will be a steel tank encased in concrete. Trustee Miller asked what type of security was proposed for the facility. Mr. Baker stated that there are already thirty two security cameras at the marina for security surveillance and they will be adding sixteen more. Additionally as for potential damage to the levee, should the tank explode it is designed to blow up, not out and should not impact the levee. Trustee Harris asked if the proposed facility was a first step for more development. Mr. Baker stated that he cannot answer for the owner, but that his goal is to institute best practices according to PIE for the fuel facility. Trustee Smith asked if the pump was in side the tank. Mr. Baker stated that it was on top of the tank and has an automatic shut off if problems are detected. Trustee Christophel asked if there is a situation that requires a flood fight in the area, assume it is erosion, would the District be able to conduct the flood fight. GM Devereux stated that if erosion were an issue the parking structure and tank would probably have already broken free. The only other issue might be seepage, but there is a slurry wall in place at that location.

Mr. Skidmore the owner of Riverbank Marina addressed the Board regarding the proposed fueling facility. He stated in response to Trustee Harris's question regarding future improvements that he has no plan for further improvements at this time. Mr. Skidmore further stated that there has been demand for a fueling station for a long time. He stated that he does not have a problem with a condition that would require the tank to be removed at the property owner's expense in the event of a flood emergency.

After discussion it was moved by Trustee Shiels to authorize the General Manager to endorse the application from Riverbank Marina for a Fuel tank and re-fueling facility with condition as discussed. The motion was seconded by Trustee Harris, duly put and carried by the following vote:

5) GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

A. Flood Season Update

General Manager Devereux informed the Board that the forecast for the season had called for a normal rainfall; so far it has been below normal. Some are now saying we are going into a La Nina or dry cycle. There is still a lot of room in the reservoirs and he stated that he feels confident that if there is an event there will not be any problems.

B. Regional Flood Control Issues

General Manger Devereux informed the Board that SAFCA made an appeal to the Corps of Engineers Headquarters in Washington DC to have the local office review the NLIP project and make decisions including issuance of the Section 408 permit. They denied the request. Senator Matsui wrote a letter to the COE asking them to reverse their decision. Having the 408 permit approval at the Headquarters level adds four to six months to the process. SAFCA staff has indicated the Section 408 Permit is on the critical path for the project. SAFCA has hired consultants to write the documents for the Corps of Engineers to speed up the process if possible. SAFCA is hoping the NLIP will be considered for funding under the economic stimulus package being negotiated by Congress and the President. The issue for construction in 2009 will be getting the agreement with the State and funding which requires the Legislature and the Governor to come to an agreement on a new State budget. The second key issues for construction this year are the agreements discussed earlier in the agenda.


- C. **Natomas Mutual Water Company Agreement**
General Manager Devereux informed the Board that he has redrafted the agreement and sent it to Dee Swearingen at the Natomas Mutual Water Company.
- D. **Encroachment Permits Endorsed/Process**
General Manager Devereux informed the Board the he has not endorsed any new encroachment permits this month.
- E. **Security Patrol Update**
GM Devereux informed the Board that Stacey Brookman has been hired as a temporary employee for approximately 90 days to provide off hour security and patrol. He has already had results. Mr. Brookman caught someone breaking in at the Natomas Mutual Water Company corporation yard. After his temporary employment Mr. Brookman will become a licensed security officer and the District along with the Natomas Basin Conservancy and the Natomas Mutual Water Company will contract with him as an independent contractor for security services.
- F. **Levee Inspections and Garden Highway Survey Status**
General Manger Devereux informed the Board that he has about fifteen properties left to inspect. He will be going out this week, this time knocking on doors as he proceeds.
- G. **Central Valley Flood Protection Board – Proposed Indemnification for Future Projects**
GM Devereux informed the Board that he has not seen this item return to the California Central Valley Flood Protection Board agenda yet.
- H. **Natomas Levee Improvement Project Update**
General Manager Devereux stated that Trustee Shiels has already covered the status of this project.

6. **Superintendent's Report**
Superintendent Blicke informed the Board staff has been working on the Novak property recently purchased by SAFCA for the Natomas Levee Improvement Project (NLIP). John Bassett told the District to do what they needed to do on the property to safely operate and maintain the levee including visibility so the crew has been trimming and removing vegetation on the levee and near the toe; filled an irrigation swale at the toe and fixed slips caused by the ditch. Staff has been applying pre-emergent on the levees from Powerline Road to the Natomas Cross Canal and has been mowing along Garden Highway. Staff has also been repairing beaver dens on the Natomas East Main Drainage Canal.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned.

WHEREAS, Reclamation District No. 1000 maintains an Operation and Maintenance Fund held by the Sacramento County Treasurer; and

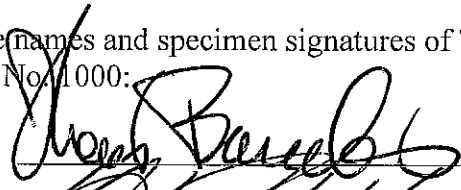

In Recognition of Alan G. Lauppe's Service as a Member of the Reclamation District No. 1000 Board of Trustees

WHEREAS Alan G. Lauppe served as a member of the Reclamation District No. 1000 Board of Trustees from his election in November 2003 until September 2008; and

WHEREAS Alan was born and raised in the District and has farmed property in the District to the present time; and,

WHEREAS as a farmer he insured the interests of the agricultural community were represented on the Board who looked to his expertise and knowledge of agricultural practices as they related to the flood control issues which came before the Board; and,

WHEREAS, staff and Board members alike respected the "common sense" approach and principles Alan brought to the sometimes difficult policies and problems which came before the Board; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as Trustee, the District completed construction of the Pump Plant 1B Project; emergency repairs to the Sacramento River levee settlement south of I-5; removal of the abandoned pump house levee repairs along the Sacramento River levee; the 2006 Flood event and emergency flood fight at the Pritchard Lake pump station and subsequent emergency repairs and initiation of the Natomas Levee Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, Alan and his family was forced to make the supreme sacrifice of losing their family home in order to accommodate the proposed Natomas Levee Improvement Project which will protect the 70,000 residents in Natomas, the outcome of which required his resignation from the Board

Now therefore be it resolved;

The Board of Trustees of Reclamation District No. 1000 gratefully acknowledge the service and contributions Alan G. Lauppe has made to the District and the Natomas community as a member of the Board with a special recognition of his representation of the agricultural community's interests while serving on the Board and the considerable personal sacrifice he has made of giving up his family home for the levee improvements necessary to provide flood protection for the greater Natomas community

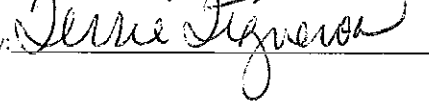

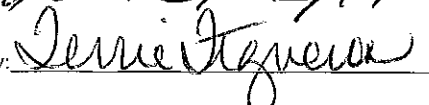

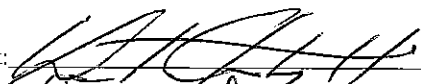
